Exceptional Care For The Life Of Your Pet

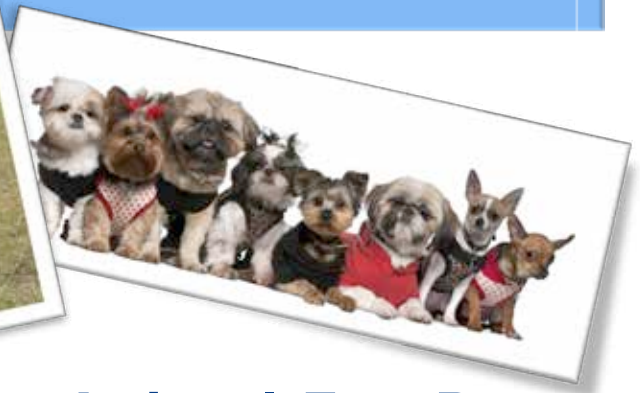
## Out of Hours Cover

AlphaPet is one of only two local practices that continue to offer its own in-house 24-hour Emergency Service and hospitalisation facilities. All other local practices require their clients to travel to either Worthing or Portsmouth if they have an emergency outside of normal hours. Patients requiring hospitalisation overnight often have to be transferred to the designated Out Of Hours (OOH) service provider in Worthing or Portsmouth.

At AlphaPet, we do not believe this is in the best interests of either our patients or our clients and we will continue to operate our own OOH service from our West Meads surgery 24/7 every day of the year.

## Puppy Parties

If you're getting a new puppy, one of the most important things you can do is to encourage them to become properly socialised as early as possible.

At AlphaPet, we have FREE puppy parties to help you do just this.

They are held at our West Meads surgery starting at 8pm for 3 consecutive Wednesdays each month but they are very popular, so please do book your place early.

As well as being great fun for both you and your new family addition, they are also an ideal opportunity to discuss behavioural and training issues with our vets or nurses running the evenings.

As long as your puppy has had their first vaccination and are under 18 weeks of age, they are safe and eligible to join the parties.

We can always recognise past attendees – they're the dogs that run into AlphaPet dragging their owners behind them!





## Summer Tips

Summer is upon us again but remember that hot weather can be a real threat to your pets. For dogs and cats, the heat really brings out the parasites such as fleas and ticks, so don't forget to keep your monthly treatments up to date.

We have Lyme disease in this area, which is transmitted by ticks so, if you're walking with your dogs, carry a tick removal tool and check them regularly.

Never leave dogs in cars on hot days. It can take as little as 20 minutes for a dog to die of heat stroke in a hot car even on an overcast day. Sadly, we still see cases every year. Even when driving, ensure that there is ample ventilation in the car. We may be able to strip down to T-shirts, but dogs and cats are still wearing fur coats!

When walking dogs, avoid the hottest times of the day by walking in the early morning and late evening.

Slugs and snails not only pose a threat to dogs from lungworm, but owners who use metaldehyde-containing slug and snail pellets, risk poisoning dogs and cats through ingestion. Even small amounts can cause significant toxicity and can be fatal. Please think before using them.

Always make sure that every pet has plenty of clean water available at all times. We recommend taking a supply of fresh water on walks and visits to the beach.

Check rabbits, guinea pigs and other small furries daily for signs of mucky bottoms, which could attract flies and risk "Flystrike" – a common but frequently fatal condition where maggots literally eat your pet alive!

Use non-scented waterproof sunblock on dogs and cats with pink ears and noses to reduce the risk of cancer. Better still, keep them out of the sun during the middle of the day.

## Fish Hooks!

Please be careful when you are walking dogs along the seashore. We have had a recent spate of dogs eating baited fish hooks, often from children's crabbing lines, which have resulted in surgery to retrieve them. We are trying to get warning notices placed in the worst affected areas, especially at East Head, but increased owner vigilance is still very necessary.
